## Java Installation for Windows

Java can be downloaded and installed from the link below.



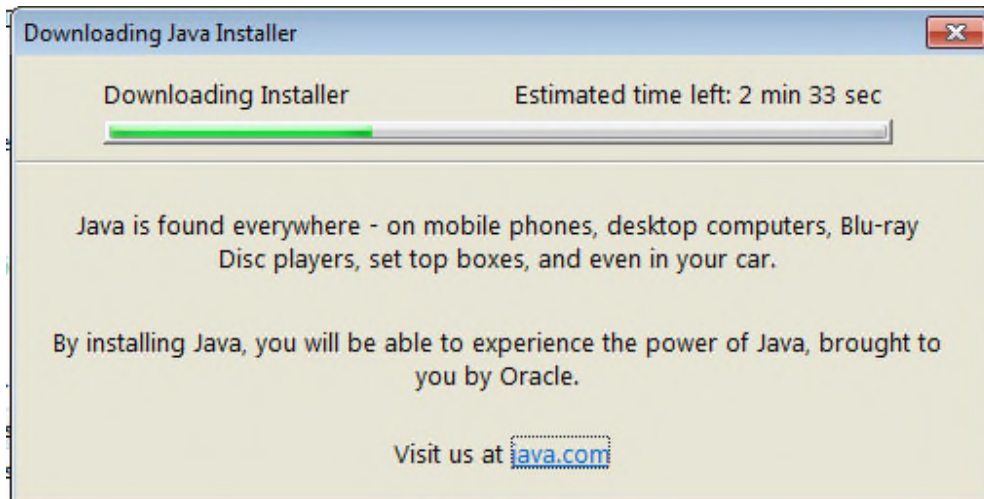
It will show information about recommended Java version and its size. Just click on the "Agree and Start Free Download" button to download java.

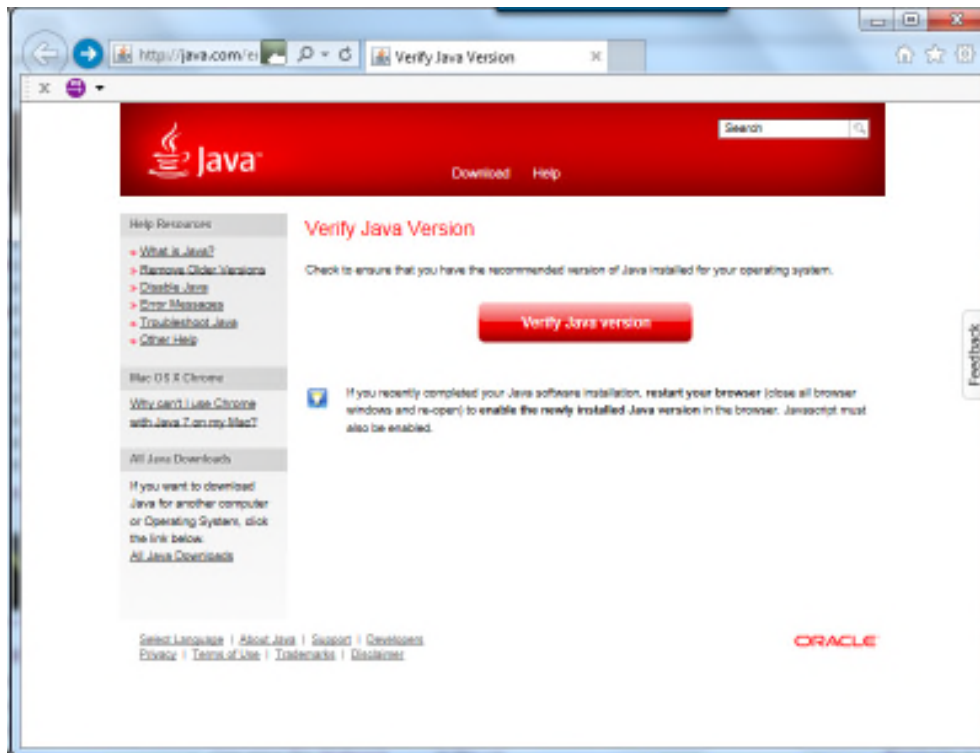
Click Run when the pop up menu appears.

Follow the installation wizard steps and install Java.

Click on Verify. Once verified it will show a pop up menu.



Click Run.

Click on enable Java widget when popup menu shows.

Java may also recommend uninstalling older versions. Click uninstall to remove these older versions from your PC
